Key Messages from Trustees Meeting 14th September 2025

- We reviewed in detail Rites of Passage charges and hire fees for church and schoolroom and set new rates.
- We looked at how we might fund work on the building to address the damp (in schoolroom) and agreed that in order to access grants and get the work done we may have to fund up to 50% of the estimated cost from our savings accounts. Jenni and Ann are working on various grant applications.
- * We agreed to progress the development plan prepared by Unitarian Transformers and funded by the GA Innovation Fund. The focus of this is to develop our community support within and outside the current congregation and to pilot an additional and alternative worship offer during the week. The next step is for Mark Hutchinson from Unitarian Transformers to visit us in October to talk with the congregation about this.
- The date of our Carol service was set as Sunday 14th December.
- Full minutes of the meeting are available on the notice board at the back of the church.

Honest Faith Group

The next Honest Faith meeting will take place on Sunday 5th October at 6.30pm in the Lecture Room, Shrewsbury United Reformed Church (by the English Bridge).

We'll explore 'Direct cremation and new funerary movements' by viewing a webinar (first streamed live 21st May 2025) from the Mission Theology & Apologetics Group (MTAG) in which Dr Anne Richards, National Public Policy Adviser for the Church of England explores with The Revd Dr Peter Colwell, Deputy General Secretary, CTBI (Churches Together in Britain and Ireland), how changing societal practices around death and funerals are affecting grief, mourning, and pastoral care. It reflects on the significance of the body in Christian theology and considers how the Church can respond with compassion and insight to evolving attitudes towards death and bereavement.
